Blanket Student Accident Insurance – provided by Division

- <u>Restricted Coverage does not extend to non school activities.</u>
- All students and staff in our division are covered under this plan for all school related activities.
- Parents do not need to apply for this coverage it is provided by the Division.
- This is a parent administrated service.
- How To Make A Claim? information brochure available from school office.

Blanket Student Travel Insurance – provided by Division

- Provides accident and sickness coverage for insured persons while traveling on school trips whether in Alberta, in Canada, or elsewhere in the world.
- All students, staff and chaperones in our division are covered under this plan.
- Coverage takes effect from the time the insured person leaves his residence until he returns to his residence.
- Parents do not need to apply for this coverage it is provided by the Division.
- This is a parent administrated service.

NOTE: These policies all complement each other. If a student has coverage on both the blanket student accident insurance and the Voluntary IAP Kids Plus accident insurance, the policies will coordinate with the parent's employer group benefit policy and with each other to provide coverage to a maximum of 100% of the expense.

Advantages of being in Work Experience

Any student who is currently working or will work is eligible for work experience credits. There are many benefits for students who earn credits in work experience.

High School Diploma and Graduation Benefits

- 15 credits may be used to earn a high school diploma
- Grade 12's can use up to 15 credits of work experience to help them be on the first grad list (90 earned credits by the end of semester one of their graduation year)
- Students can fulfill the high school diploma requirement of needing 10 credits in Grade 12 level courses other than English and Social by completing Work Experience 35.



Alexander Rutherford Scholarship

*see back of sheet for requirements *this scholarship is open to all students in Alberta

 The mark in Work Experience 15, 25, and 35 can be used to help students qualify for the Alexander Rutherford Scholarship (\$300 to \$400 for grade10) (\$500 to \$800 for grade 11) and (\$700 to \$1300 for grade 12) (the lower amount is for a 75% average and the higher amount is for an 80% average)

Timetable Advantage

- Students may have up to a 3-credit spare in grade 11, if they have completed or are completing 10 credits of work experience. Otherwise, Grade 11's are not allowed any spares. (work experience credits earned in grade 10 qualify for the grade 11 spare)
- Grade 12 students are required to carry a minimum of 30 credits in courses in their grade 12 year, but students may use 10 credits of work experience to assist in meeting this 30 credit load requirement. (credits earned in grade 10 or 11 can be banked for the grade 12 year)

Financial Incentives Work Experience Bonus and Credit Completion Scholarship

 Students can also work toward the work experience bonus or use the work experience

credits to qualify for the credit completion scholarship of up to \$500

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM (RAP)

For High School Students Monsignor McCoy High School

The Registered Apprenticeship Program (called RAP) is a modified apprenticeship program that permits a high school student to become an apprentice while attending high school.

A RAP apprentice accumulates hours of on-the-job training as credit toward his or her apprenticeship, and credit toward a high school diploma.

Why RAP?

- Skilled trades people are in short supply. A RAP apprentice begins learning a skilled trade.
- RAP gives employers an opportunity to find quality young employees, and to participate in their educational process.
- RAP offers an enriched high school education and provides an opportunity to learn the skills industry needs.
- A RAP apprentice gets a realistic look at the work world and learns employability skills.

Who can employ a RAP Apprentice?

Anyone who is eligible to employ an apprentice can employ a RAP apprentice.

How is a RAP Apprentice different from a regular apprentice?

- A RAP apprentice is a full-time high school student.
- A RAP apprentice must be paid at least minimum wage.
- Apprenticeship's formal or technical training is delayed until the RAP student completes high school.
- Alberta Education is responsible for Worker's Compensation coverage for RAP apprentices.

Employer Benefits:

- · Builds a community based work force
- WCB covered by Alberta Education
- · Guidance by workplace mentor
- Participate in the development of your future work force
- Integrates trade training in high school education process
- · Develops employability skills, feedback and performance review

How much time does a RAP apprentice spend on the job?

The employer, the student/parent, and the school determine the hours of work.


- Grade 10: Majority of the students begin in the summer following Grade 10 with a 125 hour pre-RAP internship prior to registering with Apprenticeship and Industry Training. They work full time during the Grade 10 summer.
- In Grade 11, students may continue as a RAP apprentice working after school, weekends, and holidays, and returning full time during the summer following Grade 11.
- In Grade 12, students may continue as a RAP apprentice working after school, weekends, and holidays. Most try to arrange their timetables to accommodate in one semester a half-day at the workplace during the Grade 12 school year.

What are the entrance requirements?

- Good academic standing, particularly in Math, Science and English
- · Excellent attendance at school, good citizenship and attitude
- HCS 3000 Job Preparation Module
- CSTS Safety Training prior to placement
- 125 hours Work Experience (pre-RAP Internship, pay optional)

STUDENT CONDUCT ON SCHOOL BUSES

Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education

Our goal is to ensure the safety of our students, and in partnership with our transportation provider, we are providing you with the general rules for school bus conduct. We want to work together to create a positive school bus experience for our students.

PRIOR TO GETTING ON THE SCHOOL BUS (on the road and at school)

- Be on time at your designated bus stop.
- Stay off the road at all times while waiting for the bus. Students must conduct themselves in a safe manner while waiting and must not interfere with other students who are also at the bus stop.
- Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before attempting to enter.
- Students should wear clothing that is appropriate for the outside weather. If a breakdown or collision occurs the bus may have to be evacuated, regardless of the outside temperature.

WHILE ON THE SCHOOL BUS

- The bus driver is in full charge of the school bus at all times and students must obey the driver promptly.
- The bus driver may assign a seat for which the student will be held responsible and he/she will retain this seat until directed otherwise by the bus driver.
- Unnecessary conversation with the bus driver is not allowed.
- Classroom conduct is to be observed on the school bus and any disturbance which may take the bus driver's attention and endanger the safe operation of the bus is prohibited.
- Passengers may not eat on any school bus. This is a shared environment and can potentially cause a severe allergic reaction in other students.
- There is no smoking or the use of alcohol or drugs on any school bus.
- Students must not litter the bus with paper or other garbage or throw any articles out of the school bus windows.
- Students must not extend any part of their body out of the windows.
- Students must remain seated while the school bus is in motion.

LEAVING THE SCHOOL BUS

- Students are responsible for getting off the bus at their designated stop.
- When leaving the bus, students must remain on the sidewalk until the bus has moved safely away.
- The driver will not discharge passengers at places other than a designated bus stop.

SPECIAL TRIPS (Extracurricular & Field Trips)

- The same rules apply to all school trips and all passengers on such trips.
- Passengers on special trips shall additionally respect the wishes and directions of school appointed chaperones provided for the bus.

SCHOOL BUS DRIVER RESPONSIBILITIES

- School bus drivers are responsible for the discipline of passengers while entering, leaving and riding on the bus.
- School bus drivers may recommend to the principal that a passenger be suspended from riding the bus for a specified period of time for breaking any of the busing rules.

Students violating these rules may be reported to the school principal and may be suspended from riding the bus until assurance is received from parents and the student that these rules will be observed.


Welcome Back
